# Granite Countertops

The natural stone you have purchased for your home or office is an investment that will give you years of beautiful service. Granite is a natural product, simple care and maintenance will keep it looking beautiful. Here are some recommendations for routine care and cleaning:

Clean stone surfaces with a few drops of a neutral cleaner, stone soap or a mild liquid dishwashing detergent and warm water. Use clean rags for best results. Too much cleaner or soap on the granite may leave a film and cause streaks. Do not use products that contain lemon, vinegar or other acids on the granite countertops. The high acid content may etch the surface. Rinse the surface thoroughly with clean water after washing with the soap solution and dry with a soft cloth. Change the rinse water frequently. Do not use scouring powders or creams; these products contain abrasives that may scratch the surface.

## CARE AND MAINTENANCE FOR GRANITE COUNTERTOPS

### Do's and Don'ts

- Do dust surface frequently.
- Do clean surfaces with mild detergent or stone soap.
- Do thoroughly rinse and dry the surface after washing.
- Do blot up spills immediately
- Don't use vinegar, lemon juice or other cleaners containing acids.
- Don't use cleaners that contain acid such as bathroom cleaners, grout cleaners, or tub and tile cleaners.
- Don't use abrasives cleaners such as dry cleansers or soft cleansers.
- Don't mix bleach and ammonia; this combination creates a toxic and lethal gas.
